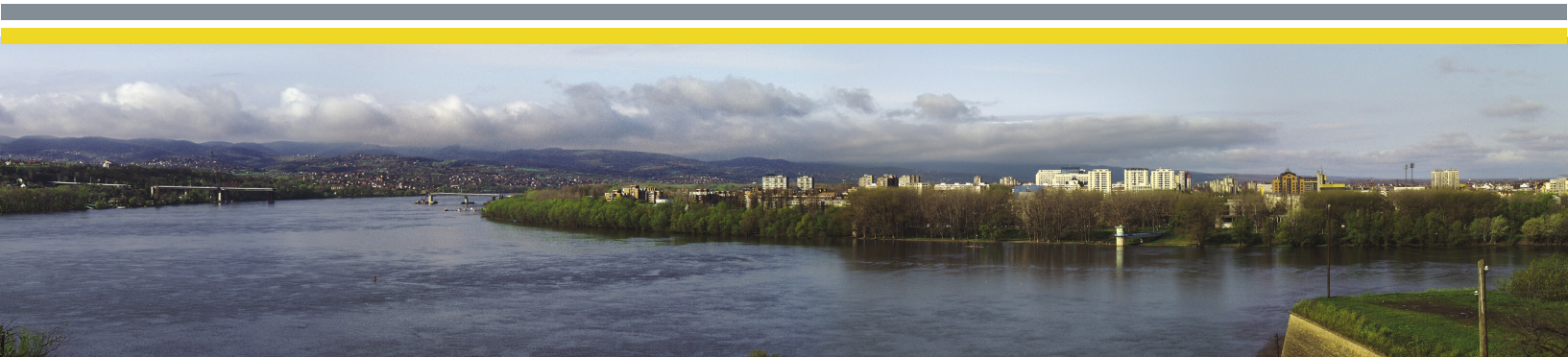


POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN EUROPEAN STUDIES (in English)

“EUROPEAN STUDIES ACROSS BORDERS”



PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

The “European Studies Across Borders” programme is an answer to the emerging need for experts in European issues in Serbia and the wider region.

It is also designed for international students interested to learn and work in South East Europe. Besides general obligatory modules in EU economy, law and politics, there is a list of specific issues from the three main fields and a number of elective courses in the history and culture of South East Europe. The interdisciplinary postgraduate Master’s Degree is designed to train domestic and international experts to meet the future challenges of economy, federal/state governments and international organisations.

As highly qualified and innovative experts, they will be able to work in the EU market and their expertise will be at the disposal of the EU institutions.

INTERNATIONAL TEACHING STAFF

Professors from University of Novi Sad, University of Belgrade, Babes-Bolyai University in Cluj, University of Münster, Nottingham Trent University and Central European University in Budapest.

COURSE CONTENT

Three core subjects are taught: Politics of European Union, Institutions and Law of European Union and Economics of European Union. Research methodology is also an obligatory course. Students are obliged to pass general exam (advanced level) in one of the following languages: German, French, Italian, Serbian (for foreigners) and Spanish. In the same language they have to study terminology of Social Sciences as a separate course. Students will also have the opportunity to go deeper into some subjects or to approach new issues, depending on their individual interests. The minimum of five elective courses can be selected from a list of twenty optional courses.

DURATION

Students complete the programme in approximately two years. They take six obligatory modules and courses (including the second language) and five optional courses during three semesters, whereas the fourth semester is reserved for the work on master's thesis.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants for "European Studies Across Borders" need to have:

- Bachelor's degree in any field [first higher education degree] from a recognized university
- Good command of English in writing and speaking
- Basic computer skills
